What is OASIS?

- OASIS is a data capture form
- Archaeological and heritage practitioners provide information about their investigations to local HERs and respective National Heritage Bodies.
- Users can upload unpublished reports: these are transferred into the ADS Library
- Development of the form and maintenance funded by Historic England and Historic Environment Scotland.



What is OASIS?

- Current OASIS form dates to 2003/4
 - 31,000+ records from England
 - 33,566 reports from England transferred to ADS
 - People love having access to these reports!
- But...
- Old technologies
- Redundant workflows
- Some reports never work their way through...



Enter HIAS

- Heritage Information Access Strategy (HIAS)
- Historic England funded "programme of interlinked projects designed to <u>simplify and</u> <u>improve public access to heritage data</u> held or generated by Historic England, by Local Authority Historic Environment Records and by other bodies"

Enter HIAS

- The redevelopment of OASIS is a HIAS Work Package.
- Stage 1 (completed 2015) looked at user requirements for a new form.
 - Emphasis on simplicity
 - Emphasis on building a system that is to be used by all those working and carrying out research in the historic environment



A new OASIS

- Now in Stage 2: the redevelopment!
- Use of modern technologies to facilitate accurate and consistent data
- Easy to use
- Flexible workflows
- Simple instant transfer of all reports into ADS Library
- Records always open!



Timescales

Database and Java framework

Pre-Alpha testing in Autumn 2018

Alpha testing Spring 2019

Public beta March 2020



What have we done?

- A new database is in place (PostgreSQL + PostGIS)
- New data structure
 - Record less core data (but record it better!)
 - Ability to record more for certain projects(OASIS+)


New Admin module

- Stops people registering more than once!
- Identical names/emails are reminded they already exist
- Easy password recovery
- Flexibility: able to change role, activity in one click

Space is the Place

- Allow the location of a project to be recorded accurately
 - OS admin areas
 - HER areas
 - Museum collecting areas
 - Research Framework areas







Research Frameworks

- Highlight spatially relevant records
- Space to incorporate research questions
- Allow user to select their project as answering specific question
- Allow a Research Framework user to update questions for their areas
